Isaiah 59 (New International Version)

Sin, Confession and Redemption

1 Surely the arm of the LORD is not too short to save, nor his ear too dull to hear.

2 But your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear.

3 For your hands are stained with blood, your fingers with guilt. Your lips have spoken lies, and your tongue mutters wicked things.

4 No one calls for justice; no one pleads his case with integrity. They rely on empty arguments and speak lies; they conceive trouble and give birth to evil.

5 They hatch the eggs of vipers and spin a spider's web. Whoever eats their eggs will die, and when one is broken, an adder is hatched.

6 Their cobwebs are useless for clothing; they cannot cover themselves with what they make. Their deeds are evil deeds, and acts of violence are in their hands.

7 Their feet rush into sin; they are swift to shed innocent blood. Their thoughts are evil thoughts; ruin and destruction mark their ways.

8 The way of peace they do not know; there is no justice in their paths. They have turned them into crooked roads; no one who walks in them will know peace.

9 So justice is far from us, and righteousness does not reach us. We look for light, but all is darkness; for brightness, but we walk in deep shadows.

10 Like the blind we grope along the wall, feeling our way like men without eyes. At midday we stumble as if it were twilight; among the strong, we are like the dead.

11 We all growl like bears; we moan mournfully like doves. We look for justice, but find none; for deliverance, but it is far away.

12 For our offenses are many in your sight, and our sins testify against us. Our offenses are ever with us, and we acknowledge our iniquities:

13 rebellion and treachery against the LORD, turning our backs on our God, fomenting oppression and revolt, uttering lies our hearts have conceived.

14 So justice is driven back, and righteousness stands at a distance; truth has stumbled in the streets, honesty cannot enter.

15 Truth is nowhere to be found, and whoever shuns evil becomes a prey. The LORD looked and was displeased that there was no justice.

16 He saw that there was no one, he was appalled that there was no one to intervene; so his own arm worked salvation

for him, and his own righteousness sustained him.

17 He put on righteousness as his breastplate, and the helmet of salvation on his head; he put on the garments of vengeance and wrapped himself in zeal as in a cloak.

18 According to what they have done, so will he repay wrath to his enemies and retribution to his foes; he will repay the islands their due.

19 From the west, men will fear the name of the LORD, and from the rising of the sun, they will revere his glory. For he will come like a pent-up flood that the breath of the LORD drives along.

20 "The Redeemer will come to Zion, to those in Jacob who repent of their sins," declares the LORD.

21 "As for me, this is my covenant with them," says the LORD. "My Spirit, who is on you, and my words that I have put in your mouth will not depart from your mouth or from the mouths of

your children, or from the mouths of their descendants from this time on and forever," says the LORD.

Primitive Camping

Any number of primitive camp sites are available just outside of Iowa Falls at the Iowa Falls Evangelical Free Church. Right along the Iowa River and just before mosquito season. No charge of course. The Army National Guard Armory is 1 mile from the church. Our campers can use the showers at the Armory for no charge.

- **Circle C Campgrounds.** We have 15 full service sites reserved. We can reserve more if we need to and do so in a timely manner. Cost is \$14/night. Merlin Clock, the owner, “promises” to have shower facilities ready by this weekend. These showers would also be available to our primitive campers. Circle C Campground is about 2 miles from Iowa Falls. Circle C Campground campers can also use the showers at the Armory, free of charge. Call 641.648.9936 for reservations.

Motels

- **Super 8 Motel.** We have 30 rooms reserved with a mix of singles, doubles, and suites. Suites are \$75/night, singles and doubles are \$65/night. Reserved for the nights of May 23 & 24 (Friday and Saturday). Super 8 will hold these rooms until May 13. Reservations can be made with a credit card. Request “Sons of God MC” block. Smoking and non-smoking rooms available. Call 641.648.4618 for reservations.

- **AmeriInn.** We have 30 rooms reserved here starting at \$70/night with 2 queen beds. Rates go up somewhat with more beds amenities, etc. Rooms will be held in our block until May 2. Reserve with credit card asking for the “Sons of God MC®” rooms. Smoking and non-smoking rooms available. These are the nicest rooms in Iowa Falls. Call 641.648.4600 for reservations.

- **Scenic Inn.** The property does not hold blocks of rooms in reserve as they have a significant construction worker business. They will however accept credit card reservations for rooms that are not booked. Room rate is \$35 for singles, \$48 for doubles. Call 641.648.2553 for reservations.

More Chapter News

From the Delaware Chapter

My name is Kenny Kellam, "KK", from the Delaware Chapter. I am 50 years old. I was an alcoholic and a drug addict before the age of 20. It was an everyday thing, the only way I knew. I have been through the Delaware Prison system and in and out of rehab most of my adult life. I have always loved the Lord even in my addiction. I was saved in July 1989 and in 1991 lost everything I had and owned – my 1st marriage, family, job, and driver's license. My addictions got worse.

In November of 1996, I met Lisa who is now my wife. A little while after that I signed myself into rehab again. She was there for me the whole time. I came out of there leaving the hard drugs behind, but kept on drinking and smoking my weed knowing that I was an alcoholic. It got to the point that I was drinking all the time; all the time, day and night. I still worked everyday but drank at least 30 beers everyday for the last 6 years, all the while going to church and bible study every week.

In 2004, I was interested in getting another motorcycle (even though I didn't have a license) and I met Samson, President of the Delaware Chapter of SOG MC®. I bought a motorcycle from him and met some of his brothers and sisters in the club. They invited me to a lot of events they had and I became a hang around knowing I could not join while I drank. I felt so much better about everything – life itself and got closer to God. I still drank my beer, but never in front of them. They all pretty much knew, but knew God was going to take that from me one day. Just like my wife knew too. She knew that I loved the Lord but struggled with the addiction. They all believed for a miracle for me.

On July 3, 2006, God blessed us with a beautiful boy, Kenneth Garrett Kellam and yet I still drank. Things got rocky in our home because of my drinking.

On July 7, 2007 some of the SOG MC® and the Bible Study members went to the Gospel Café and **God laid on my heart that I had my fill of alcohol and that I didn't have to be a slave to it any longer. Thank God!** My last drink was on July 12, 2007 at 10:15 in the morning. I gave myself about a month and made a doctors appointment for a blood test and physical. I told the doctor what was going on with the drugs and alcohol and how much and he looked like he was going to fall out of the chair. After telling him everything, he tested me for **everything**. He didn't know that after prayer a few weeks prior, there was a Word that God had healed every organ in my body from all the abuse. I give God all the Glory. He took the addictions from me. My results came back clean. God had made me **WHOLE AGAIN** – No liver problems, no kidney problems – nothing. Everything is normal. You see at that time I only weighed about 126 lbs.

I now have a driver's license after 17 years and am very proud to be a prospect for the SOG MC® since January 19, 2008. I want to thank my wife, daughter (Whitney) and all the Sons of God MC® for their prayers and support. I give God all the credit. God Bless.

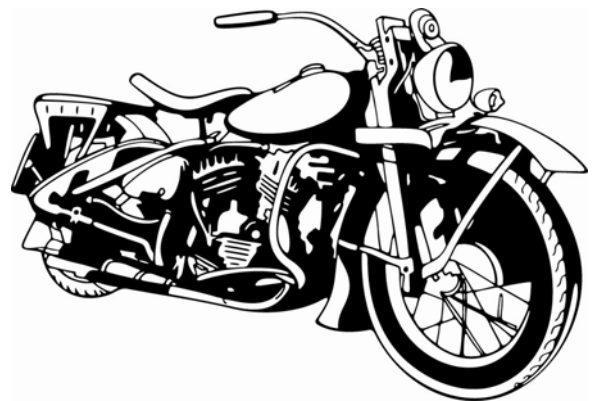
